

SEN (Special Educational needs) Policy

At Happy Days Day Nursery we apply the Special Educational Needs code of practice to ensure that all children with SEN and their families are welcomed and fully included in all aspects of nursery life. Staff access ongoing training to ensure that children with SEN are identified at the earliest opportunity and through activities and attention to any related health care needs, they make the maximum progress possible.

Graduated Approach

Cycle of Action

All children will be identified as early as possible through:

- Observations
- Playing / working with the child
- Talking with parents/ carers
- Monitoring progress through EYFS tracking
- Gathering of all information from all staff

We would consult with parents, complete an early identification Assessment Summary form to start the cycle of 'Assess, Plan, Do and Review'.

SEN Support

Happy Days will implement and record development targets and strategies over a period of time to enable the child to progress and develop. These targets will be written as SMART targets: Specific, Measurable, Achievable, realistic and Timed. We will set targets in partnership with parents, and a review date, before deciding on the next stage of action.

During the cycle of Assess, Plan, Do, Review support and guidance may be needed from specialists such as Speech and Language, Health Visitors, Educational Psychologists and other professionals.

Information from Parents, practitioners and external agencies are collaborated to make a referral for a formal assessment relating to the child having an Education, Health and Care Plan.

During this time we will continue to implement the child's targets and continue to gather evidence in relation to the child's development.

Staff access termly training, updates and network meetings from the Early Years Team.

Happy Days Day Nursery will continually monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the SEN Policy.

Jo/Sarah will attend regular and targeted training.

Staff Training:

- Relevant information will be shared with staff members at regular staff meetings.
